

Notes from the January Administrative Council Meeting, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Bud Newbrough and opened with prayer. The minutes of the December 3, 2019 meeting were distributed and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report: Jeff Ekstrom

All bills have been paid. Humphrey's church paid in full. PALS is paid up to May 2020. To date, \$1,361 has been donated to the Christmas Basket fund in memory of Ron Colby.

Advent decorations will be taken down Monday, January 13th at 10:00am.

Parsonage: Marilyn Morton

The church is going to buy a stove, microwave, and exhaust vent for the parsonage.

PPR: Wayne Kersey

Christmas gifts were divided among employees totaled \$1,647. Pastor Richie will be given an additional \$1,500 gift. Funds will be taken from the yard sale fund. Lakeview UMC and St. Paul's Church worked together to provide 62 Christmas baskets to needy individuals at the towers in St. Albans. \$3,411.64 remains in the 5K Run Fund. We will sponsor another race again this year.

Trustees are down by 40% regarding committee members able to help maintain the church. The church will need help soon. A cart is in the Secretary's office with speakers and an amplifier available for use.
