

In the Pastor's Corner

Temptation

Luke 4:1-2 "Jesus returned from the Jordan, full of the Holy Spirit, and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness for 40 days to be tempted by the Devil."

As I drive by the Crispy Crème Donut Shop in South Charleston my sweet tooth begins to taste the sweetness of the glazed soft shell that opens up with a rewarding vanilla filling. There you have it, my temptation, and then when I finally get home in Saint Albans I pass that wonderful Tim Hortons which also has that donut that my sweet tooth craves. I wonder if I was tempted in the desert just like Jesus would Satan have led me to turn stones into donuts (instead of bread)? I don't think I could have been as strong as Jesus but with God's help and our faith in Him we can move mountains!

I recently read a short devotion written by an author named Beth Moore and putting it in my short basic words here is what I learned. God's Word tells us that Christ was tempted just as we are. So I believe that long before He was thirty years old, Christ experienced numerous other temptations exactly like those we face in our day-to-day struggles. What thirty-year-old hasn't been tempted?

Yet although Christ's experience in the desert wasn't His first grapple with temptation, it did represent an intense season that was tailored by the enemy for the challenges of messiahship that lay ahead. Some issues were meant to be settled from the very beginning of Christ's ministry.

Hebrews 4:15 "We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tested in every way as we are, yet without sin."

Motion carried (Bud/Fred) to accept the March minutes as printed.

Freda Cutlip, manager of Jericho House, explained the workings of the House and some of the needs. An open house for the new addition is scheduled for Sunday, April 19th and everyone is invited. She also answered questions that were asked by Council members.

Treasurer's Report - The report was accepted (Don/Jason) as printed. Jeff noted that we were able to make 1 ½ Apportionment payments this month-leaving us only ½ payment behind for the year.

Christian Education - The Easter egg hunt on Sunday was well received. We are anticipating getting more eggs because of the increase in numbers of children. Also plans are underway for the children to present flowers on Mother's Day.

A motion carried (Bud/Marilyn Colby) that the extra monies collected at the luncheon (\$216.25) be put in the Nurture Committees fund to cover expenses they may incur later in the year.

Parsonage - No report.

The roots are causing the driveway to crack & buckle and some neighbors are sharing their dislike for them (leaves, branches, etc.) Fred McKinney will proceed with getting some quotes for this.
