#### Starving For Christ!

Psalm 84:2, "My heart and my flesh cry out for the living God."

This month we start the Lenten Season again and I'm truly excited and pumped up! Brothers and sisters I love to eat! I don't eat because of stress or because of some clinical problem. I eat because I love the taste of food! As you all know I love donuts. But my other favorites are pizza, hamburgers, pastas, steak, and Mexican. These past couple of years I have given up many types of food and other things for the Lenten Season. But God has really put a very serious thing on my heart and physical body for this up and coming Lenten.

In Luke 4:1-8, "Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the desert, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry. The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread.' Jesus answered, 'It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone.' The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to him, 'I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. So if you worship me, it will all be yours.' Jesus answered, 'It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'"

This experience Jesus had is unbelievable! He ate nothing for forty days. What was He thinking? You will notice in the first verse it says that Jesus "was led by the Spirit in the desert." Today people really fast from food for forty days and I have seen this from inmates in prison and I have witnessed other pastors do it as well. When they fast they don't just cut out chocolate or Coke and Pepsi from their fast but all foods and drinks other than water. This fast that they do only consists of water, natural fruit

juices, and chicken broth or other broths as well. That's it and I am amazed by this! I have seen some not complete it and I have seen a few complete it and the ones who completed it had an experience with Christ that was unexplainable.

Brothers and sisters are you starving for Christ or are you starving for the wrong things? Me personally I feel as if I need to get a little closer to Christ at this point in my life. So, this Lenten Season I feel led to take on this very serious fast. I feel as if my soul and heart need to do this. I feel truly led by the Holy Spirit to take this on. Not to lose weight, not to get healthier, but to get closer to Christ. My life seems to be really starving for a much deeper relationship with Christ. For Jesus, I believe, was led to do this not just to get tested, but to get even closer to the Heavenly Father while here on earth. Think about this? Jesus, even Jesus, needed to be closer. So what does that tell us? That we need our relationship perfected to the highest of the high with Christ everyday here on earth. You can never be too close to God!

So, if you see your pastor physically stumbling and his eyes look glazed over like a drunken sailor. Don't be alarmed because I'm fasting for real! I warn you I may be very irritable, my attitude may seem different, my speech may be slurred, my thought process may be weird, and my skin may be really pale white. So, please don't get freaked out with me but pray for me because during this fast I will be praying for your fast and your relationship with Christ. If you are starving to be closer Christ then seek Him to the fullest. Truly give up something for Him this year and begin a new closer walk with Thee. Amen!

#### ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The meeting was called to order by Ron Colby, and Charlie Fry opened the meeting with a devotion – "Elvira Had a Task". Those present in addition to Charlie & Ron were Marilyn Colby, Bud Newbrough, Karen Ekstrom, Jason & Robin Black, Karen Kersey, Dave Ashley and Don & Marilyn Morton. Motion (Bud/Robin) to accept the January minutes as printed.

Treasurer's Report – Karen reported that January was a good month money wise, and we were able to make our Apportionment payment for the month. Also monies collected for Haiti have been forwarded to the Conference with that designation. Motion (Don/Bud) to accept the January report as printed.

**Finance -** Finance Committee met and determined that the church owes the

Building Fund \$2790. and we are repaying this at \$126. per month. We had a balance in our checking account the end of December and the Finance Committee is recommending that we take \$1260 out of that, to pay to our Building Fund. This payment along with our \$126 per month will pay off the church debt to the Building Fund by the end of 2010. The Finance Committee also recommends that the \$1260 we pay to the Building Fund be used to double our next payment to the bank on our Building Fund. This resolution passed unanimously.

Wellness – The committee made \$410 on sub sandwich sales on Sunday, and plans to use this money to purchase new tables for the multipurpose room. The cost of new tables is approximately \$100 each. Because this sale was a success and more funds are needed to purchase other tables, the committee plans to have a baked potato luncheon immediately after church on Sunday, March 7<sup>th</sup>. There will be

toppings for the potatoes, peanut butter sandwiches for the kids and cookies for all.

Christian Education – Ron Colby noted that we are gratefully indebted to Karen Kersey for having the Sunday School Class for our young people and invited others to help her in this endeavor.

**Family Ministries** – The committee is pursuing activities that were previously announced:

- (1) Bread & Company started last Wednesday. Logistics are being worked out John Carr & Dick Thompson will do the shopping & cooking and a schedule is being worked out for others to clean up. Starting this week we will begin at 5:45 pm to allow those attending time to get to the "Bible Study" at 7 pm.
- (2)We will have a *Religious Arts Festival*, Sunday, April 11<sup>th</sup>. Some of the activities are as follows:
  - a. 5 art experiences for children (Karen Kersey will head up the experiences and lots of moms will assist.)
  - b. 2 art opportunities for adults -
    - i. put an "art" object of yours that has special meaning to you, on display with a note of its spiritual importance to you
    - *ii.* create an original piece of art.
  - c. Culinary art classes for middle/high school to adults. Dick Thompson will lead a class in smoker cooking and Chris Bennett (born in Greece) will teach how to make Greek favorites.
  - d. On-line book study for those interested, The Me I Want to Be, Wayne Kersey will handle ordering books and networking with those who want to participate.

- e. At the Festival, families can view the artwork, eat dinner, and watch Parables acted out from the Bible.
- f. We will end the evening with music, singing together in the sanctuary.

**Outreach** – Bud Newbrough has volunteered to take our collected food from Souper Bowl Sunday and from the kids to Christ's Kitchen.

An article has been submitted to the United Methodist monthly magazine regarding our Cantata, both churches joining together for the event. This will appear with some minor editing.

Postcards will be mailed to the neighborhood regarding our Easter services.

Lenten Devotions are being collected and will be available on computer this year.

**Parsonage** – The dishwasher has been repaired. Plans are underway for trimming the trees and roof replacement.
