To Serve For All Eternity!

Hebrews 10:34, "You have a better and an enduring possession for yourselves in heaven."

The New Year is here! 2010 has begun and there are many new adventures for us to seek and do. For Leslie and me it has been a fast and awesome year and a half! ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The meeting was called to order by Ron Colby, and Bill Casto opened the meeting with a devotion. Those present were Ron Colby, Franki Noble, Bud Newbrough, Jeff Ekstrom, Jason & Robin Black, Fred McKinney, Karen Kersey, Pastor Richie, Bill Casto and Don & Marilyn Morton. Motion (Bud/Don) to accept the December minutes as printed.

Nurture - The committee will meet January 25, 7 pm at the church.

Nurture will have an "after church social" on Sunday, February 14.

If requested to host one of the Wednesday lunches for Lent, for the joint church services, the committee agreed to handle this.

Treasurer's Report - Jeff reported that December was another fabulous month money wise. People caught up on their pledges and some extra money was received, and we paid our Apportionment for 2009 in full. We were able to put \$1000 toward our parsonage roof fund.

We collected \$80 at the Cantata and this will be forwarded to Christ's Kitchen. Treasurer's report was accepted as printed (Don/Fred).

Finance - As a point of interest the balance owed on our building note is \$44,301. We have \$12,000 in our Building Fund Money Market and with two years of payments plus this fund, we will be within a couple thousand dollars of paying off our loan.

Family Ministries - Family Ministries had their first meeting of the year, and eight ladies plus Richie shared their ideas,

concerns and dreams about Lakeview and how we can nurture children plus the entire Lakeview family toward a closer relationship with God.

One starting program will be Bread & Company at 6 pm, Wednesdays, beginning in February (snack supper-which will be soup & bread). Dick Thompson & John Carr will spearhead this venture.

Another program will be a quarterly get together of the women of the church. Marilyn Morton will coordinate organizing this group. Potential meetings might include tea, an inspirational message, and include work on a craft or common project, etc.

There will be a game night February 20. Judy Belcher will handle this.

There will be a movie night. Janet Pennington will handle this.

A children's Christmas play/dinner is scheduled for the next Advent season. A religious Arts Festival is being explored, also an on-line book study. All of this brings to our attention that we are a diverse group, with different requirements, but all with the same desire – *to have our children and families have a spiritual connection.*

Outreach – A full bag of items was delivered to Sojourners at Christmastime. (items collected on the tree in the back of the sanctuary).

Plans are to start collecting items for Christ's Kitchen for *Souper Bowl* Sunday, February 7th.

An article has been submitted to the United Methodist monthly magazine regarding our Cantata, both churches joining together for the event.

Twenty one Christmas baskets were filled and delivered by Lakeview.

We will be looking for some other mission projects for our church in addition to the Salvation Army Bell Ringing, Hospice

"Love Light Tree" and Christmas baskets which Lakeview regularly does.

Parsonage – The dishwasher needed to be fixed. Jeff's Appliance has ordered the part to be installed next week.

Trustees – The trustees met Monday evening and assigned responsibility for a number of projects for 2010 (listed elsewhere in the newsletter).

Worship – The committee met prior to the Council meeting and outlined upcoming services.

The committee will be putting together devotionals for use during the Lenten season.

Pastor's Report - Pastor Richie stated that he feels excited about the great support that came from both churches for the Cantata and the impact that it made on our community.

Also, he was excited about the Family Ministries meeting that he attended and the ideas that originated in the meeting.

There is some concern regarding the staffing of the nursery and children's church, but first step will be to make calls and make sure we are staffed, and then if we need to – to seek outside staffing.

It was also noted that both of the churches (Lakeview & St. Luke) met their Apportionment 100% for 2009.

The people of Lakeview are humbled by the way in which they have handled the planning, the construction and the financing of the church renovation completed in 2001. At that time, we began a project that would cost approximately \$250,000. We pay \$1,260.00 each month to the bank on the loan for the
